WEDNESDAY, JUNE 25, 2025 - Hypothetical Projects is proud to present **FANADDICT** at the 2025 Winnipeg Fringe Festival!

From the creator of *How to Live Forever* (Nominee, 2023 Harry S. Rintoul Award) comes a new play scrolling back through the history of the Internet. FANADDICT examines our current online culture and what people will do to stay relevant. The play combines digital video with the analog medium of theatre to explore what happens to YouTubers when the cameras turn off.

Raised in front of a camera, Luke has been famous for as long as he can remember. The one thing he doesn't remember is being given a choice. Luke begins to question who he is outside of the fame when Kendra, a teenage superfan, wins a meet and greet with her favourite influencer.

"I come from a background of both theatre and film," Finlayson explains. "I was really drawn to this image of a camera feed projected onstage and what the audience can see that the camera doesn't."

FANADDICT was workshopped by a team of playwrights across Canada through the 2024 RealWheels National Playwriting Circle. An excerpt is available for preview on their podcast, Waveforms. Finlayson also received the inaugural Dan Augusta Promise Prize from Sick + Twisted Theatre in support of this project.

FANADDICT is written and directed by **Daphne Finlayson** with sound design by **Paul De Gurse**. The cast features **Ethan Stark** and **Shanice Raymond** with the voices of **Lisa Chartrand**, **Madyson Richard**, **Logan Stefanson**, and **Ryland Thiessen**. Stage Manager: **Phenix Rock**.
